Assessments/Quizzes

Most of your grade in this class is from exams. Tests will be announced ahead of time and will always follow at the end of a unit. I believe students should have test grades and the opportunity to review questions as soon as possible. Therefore, the tests will always be graded and returned the following class. I highly recommend not being absent for tests because each test is more difficult because of the class' cumulative nature. In the event of an excused absence, you must make up the exam before it is graded and returned. If this is not possible, you must meet with me.

Quizzes will be given randomly to check your understanding of the content. As mentioned above, in the event of an excused absence, you must make up the quiz before it is graded and returned. If this is not possible, you must meet with me.

Homework

On average, homework will be assigned every class and it is crucial to complete it as best as possible. If you are having trouble on the homework then it is your responsibility to attend tutoring. Homework will be turned in at the beginning of class in the designated area, stapled together in order on loose-leaf paper, and completed neatly. Work that can't be read will not be graded. Khan academy will also be used throughout the year and it is your responsibility to make sure you are logged in so you can get credit. Late work will have 33% per day penalty.

Absences

In the event of an excused absence, you are responsible for inquiring about any assignments, assessments, or class notes that were missed. Students should not ask during class about what they missed. Students should inquire a classmate, email the teacher, and check the website the day they are absent as to not fall behind. Any assignment that was due on the day of an absence will be due the day the student returns.

Academic Dishonesty

Academic dishonesty (cheating, plagiarism, copying, and other forms) will be reported to the administration. If cheating occurs, a zero will be recorded and the student will be subject to the school disciplinary actions as outlined in the student handbook. Retakes and corrections will not be allowed on an assignment in which cheating occurred. Cheating includes:

- 1. Looking at someone else's test or quiz during the test or quiz
- 2. Asking questions about a test from the class before you
- 3. Asking questions about a test from a student that has previously had the class
- 4. Writing answers or formulas on anything in your possession during a test
- 5. Copying someone else's homework
- 6. The use of any electronic device during a test or quiz
